With Anglesey's Gwen Parry-Jones, Interim CEO of Great British Nuclear

In January 2024 the UK Government announced its new Civil Nuclear Roadmap heralding the dawn of a new nuclear era. I will continue to ensure that this dawn shines on new nuclear at Wylfa – be that large scale or small modular reactors.

The Nuclear Roadmap, along with the launch of Great British Nuclear - headed up by Gwen Parry-Jones - marks the first time that a Nuclear Minister has confirmed beyond doubt the Conservative UK Government's commitment to delivering new nuclear power with 24 gigawatts (GW) of electricity through nuclear by 2050. This is a quadrupling of our energy from nuclear; enough to power a quarter of British homes.

Our Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak, called Wylfa “a fantastic site because it can do both potentially giga-watt power but also could do small modular reactors”.

I have campaigned for new nuclear at Wylfa as it will bring thousands of construction jobs and hundreds of well-paid permanent roles to Ynys Môn.

The £120m Future Nuclear Enabling Fund was launched at Wylfa and the site near Cemaes is now recognised as one of the best sites for new nuclear in the UK.

I have mentioned Wylfa 60 times in the House of Commons, led Westminster debates, sat on the Nuclear Financing Bill Committee and championed green taxonomy for nuclear. I chair the cross-party APPG for Small Modular Reactors (SMRs) and the Nuclear Delivery Group. I hosted Nuclear Week in Westminster, regularly speak about our ambitions for new nuclear at Wylfa at conferences and have also written several articles on the subject.

I have brought a number of national and international companies to visit the island and shown them potential local sites for investment and growth through Anglesey Freeport and new nuclear at Wylfa.

The nuclear companies I have taken to Wylfa include KEPCO, Rolls-Royce, GE-Hitachi, Bechtel and Westinghouse. I also welcomed the US Energy Attaché on a visit to the site.

I have seen first-hand the development of nuclear plants and their impact on local communities through visits to UK sites including Hinkley C, Finland's Olkiluoto station and the Vogtle Power Station being built in the US.

Helping my Constituents

Many Brynsiencyn residents contacted me about Anglesey County Council's proposal to place double yellow lines on both sides of the village High Street. The residents felt very strongly that this was an unnecessary and unwanted move which would cause significant issues for local residents and businesses.

I visited Brynsiencyn in December where I met with representatives of the Community Council and around 45 residents to discuss their concerns. I then wrote to the Chief Executive of Ynys Môn Council to ask him why this proposal was being imposed on the village despite the objections and to reiterate that this was something residents strongly objected to.
